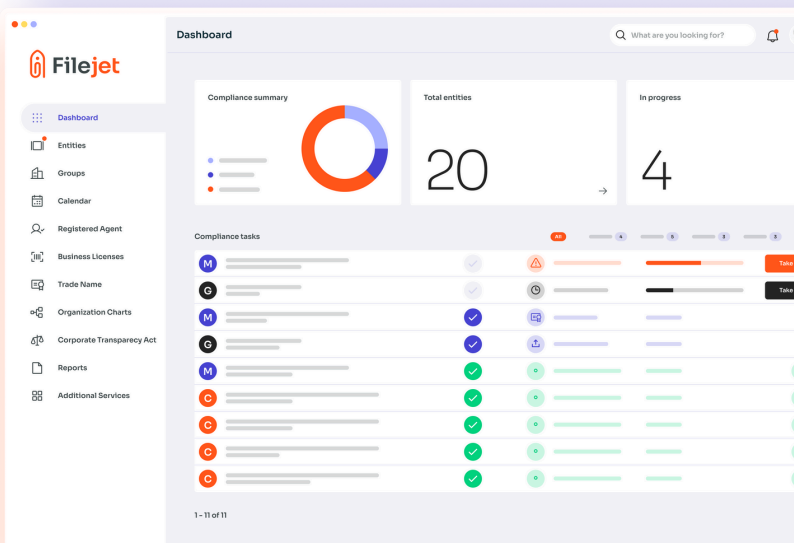

Alabama

- In Alabama, business licenses are managed at both state and local levels.

Colorado

- Connecticut does not mandate a state-level general business license. However, you can easily apply for or renew local business licenses through Connecticut's [eLicense website](#).

Delaware

- Delaware requires a state-level business license. You can easily manage & renew your business licenses with the Delaware Division of Revenue using the new [One Stop portal](#).

Washington, D.C.

- In the District of Columbia, most businesses must obtain a Basic Business License (BBL) to operate legally.
- BBLs can be renewed starting 90 days before their expiration. To renew, visit the [My DC Business Center](#).

Florida

- Licenses are issued by local authorities based on specific activities, and state-level licensing is not required.

Georgia

- Georgia does not mandate a state-level general business license. To renew your local business license, visit [this link](#).

Hawaii

- Hawaii does not require state-level general business licenses; however, local licenses may be required. Renew yours today by clicking [here](#).

Idaho

- Business licenses in Idaho are handled locally and not required at the state-level. [Click here](#) for renewal steps.

Illinois

- Illinois does not issue a state-level business license. However, businesses selling products within the state are typically required to obtain a seller's permit. Additionally, many cities and municipalities impose their own licensing requirements for various types of businesses.

Indiana

Wisconsin

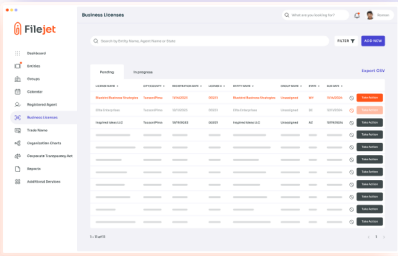
- Wisconsin does not issue a general business operating license at the state level. Instead, businesses must obtain specialty licenses, tax registrations, and local operating permits as required.

Wisconsin - Continued

- Most businesses will need to complete the Business Tax Registration to secure and maintain a seller's permit. Additionally, many localities, such as the city of Milwaukee, provide comprehensive lists of permits and licenses necessary for operation.

Wyoming

- In Wyoming, a standard business license is not required. However, businesses may need to submit an annual report, which can conveniently be filed online. Depending on the nature of their operations, some businesses may also need to obtain specific sales tax licenses.
